The Golden Rule is a 34 foot sailboat boat which, in 1958. attempted to sail to the Marshall Islands to oppose nuclear weapons testing. The voyage was unsuccessful, but it helped launch efforts for nuclear arms control in the 1960s. The boat was restored by members of Veterans For Peace in California and since 2015 has been "sailing to promote abolition of nuclear weapons."

Veterans for Peace is bringing the boat to the Twin Cities in September to begin a 11,000 mile, 15 month tour of the lower Mississippi, East Coast and into the Great Lakes. They will be stopping at hundreds of places to do public events.
