- Nuclear-armed countries continue adding to their stockpiles
- Total number of operational nuclear weapons grew in 2022
- Total worldwide inventory of nuclear weapons, including retired and operational arms, was 12,512 at the beginning of 2023.
- Nuclear competition has dramatically increased the risk that nuclear weapons might be used
- Both the U.S. and Russia have opposed the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons

"There is an urgent need to restore nuclear diplomacy and strengthen international controls on nuclear arms."
