Nuclear Weapons Are Immoral

"Now is time to affirm not only the immorality of the use of nuclear weapons, but the immorality of their possession." Pope Francis

"...a peace based on terror, a peace based upon threats of inflicting annihilation and genocide upon whole populations, is a peace that is morally corrupting." Parliament of the World's Religions 1999

Nuclear weapons are a moral issue.

Nuclear weapons are immoral because they deliberately and *unavoidably* target innocent civilians – women, children and the elderly. As weapons of mass destruction, they cannot be confined to military targets. Military strategists know that millions (or billions) of innocent people would be killed and maimed by any use of nuclear weapons. Their use would be a war crime.

Money wasted on nukes is immoral

It is immoral that our government plans to spend \$1.7 trillion to completely rebuild our nuclear arsenal while children are homeless, suffer food insecurity, lack healthcare and often attend inadequately funded schools. Nuclear weapons are the most wasteful of all military spending. We can never use them, they do not "deter" war, and everyone in the world is *less secure* simply because they exist.

All faiths support abolition of nukes

Many Christian denominations officially support the abolition of nuclear weapons. Many other faiths, – Muslim, Jewish, Buddhist and Hindu – also support abolition. **One need not be religious to understand that nukes are immoral and must be abolished**

Everyone has a responsibility to speak out

It is the responsibility of people of all faiths and congregations to advocate for moral behavior in individuals and collectively as a nation.

It is time *all* **nuclear weapons are abolished.** The Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons provides the framework to make this happen.
